

DAY ADVENTURE IN UTAH'S CANYON COUNTRY

EXPLORE NATURAL BRIDGES + BEARS EARS AREA

ESTIMATED HIKING MILEAGE: 5-6 MILES

Log 5-6 miles while exploring some of San Juan County's iconic landscapes. This one-day itinerary pairs short scenic hikes at Natural Bridges National Monument with a visit to the House on Fire archaeological site in Bears Ears National Monument, offering a memorable introduction to the landscapes and cultural history of Southeastern Utah.

SLICKROCK FOOT TRAILHEAD

1.2 MILES ROUND TRIP

This scenic trail descends into White Canyon to Sipapu Bridge, the largest natural bridge in the monument and one of the most impressive natural bridges in the world. The hike offers a closer look at the scale of the canyon and the forces that shaped this landscape over time.

0.4 MILES ROUND TRIP

A short and easy walk leads to Owachomo Bridge, known for its graceful, slender span. This viewpoint highlights the unique geology of the area and provides a great opportunity to take in the surrounding canyon landscape.

3 MILES ROUND TRIP 🐾

This trail leads to House on Fire, an Ancestral Pueblo archaeological structure located in the South Fork of Mule Canyon. When sunlight reflects off the canyon wall above the site, the rock appears to glow like flames rising from the structure, creating one of the most recognizable and photographed sites in Utah's Canyon Country.
