

# BUSINESS RESOURCES AVAILABLE IN SAN JUAN COUNTY

## AVAILABLE STARTUP +

### CUSTOM FIT

Training matching grant 50% of authorized training expense reimbursed

- Simple four step process to receive 50% of training costs

1. MEET WITH REP
2. SCHEDULE TRAINING
3. RECEIVE TRAINING
4. RECEIVE 50% REIMBURSEMENT

### REVOLVING LOAN FUND

Up to \$100,000

- Can be for start-up or established business
- Rejection from traditional lender
- One job per \$15k lent
- Ten percent owner equity required
- Various terms/conditions based on working capital, fixed assets or purchase of land needs

## AVAILABLE AFTER 1+ YEARS

### BEAR (BUSINESS EXPANSION AND RETENTION) GRANT

Overall max is \$30,000

- Project based in alignment with county strategic plan
- Applied for prior to grant award (think ahead...way ahead)
- Able to implement within fiscal year (July 1 - June 30)
- Scored higher if matching funds being provided
- Great for smaller projects using matching funds, owner investment, etc...
- Approximate project max is \$5,000

## AVAILABLE AFTER 2+ YEARS

### RURAL FAST TRACK

Up to \$50,000 match post-performance

- Two years in business (two years of filed taxes)
- At least two full time employees currently (as shown on DWS Quarterly form 33H)
- Profitable in two most recent years (as shown on your business taxes)
- Commitment to add one full time employee at 110% of average county wage (retain 12 months)
