



Recreationists and back-country travelers should be aware of a **new access road to the Hole-In-The-Rock trail**. Lake Canyon has been severely washed out. The county and the Bureau of Land Management have worked together to create this new access. **PLEASE REFER TO THE ACCOMPANYING MAP.**

Signing: Because this area is remote and weather and other conditions can act on the signs, please make sure of your route before you go. D roads are not signed by the county, so the only signing you will find are the Hole-In-The-Rock Road Access signs.

The Route: The road begins approximately 3 1/2 miles east of the turn-off to Cal Black Airport near Halls Crossing at County B Road 2131. "Hole-In-The-Rock Access" signing is soon to be installed at this junction. The new road joins B Road 261, the Nokai Dome Road about 2 miles from the beginning. Another sign will be posted at this junction. Several miles along B 261 is the junction with B 2511. There is an old 'half-track' machine sitting at this junction. Continue south on B 261. About 6 miles south of the half-track turn right or west onto a D Road, again marked with an access sign. (Remember, there are no county road number signs on D roads.) From this point, travel another 4 miles to a junction with another D road and another access sign. Turn right here and travel north approximately 2 miles to a junction with the Hole-In-The-Rock Trail. (This point is about 2 miles south of the Lake Pagahrit turnoff.) Another access sign is posted here and directs travel to either the Hole-In-The-Rock Trail or Lake Canyon.

Caution: Please be cautious when traveling along this trail. Visitors should never travel alone. More than one vehicle is recommended. Always travel with water, warm clothing, shovels, and any other emergency equipment deemed necessary. **BE SURE YOU HAVE ACCURATE AND UP TO DATE MAPS.**
